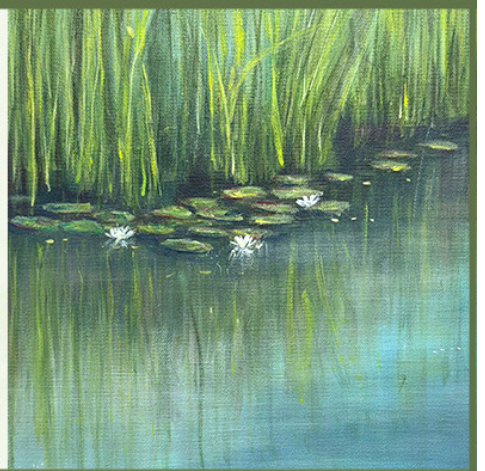
Fiber & Fire Artists' Talk, July 9

This will be a 2-day workshop class. The first day will focus on learning skills, including choosing colors, practicing brushstrokes, and blending. On the second day we will put these skills into practice. You will have one-on-one access to your teacher, who will help you to achieve the look you want. This class is welcome to all skill levels. 4-Week Pottery Series

Ready to take your pottery skills to the next level? This intermediate-level ceramics class is designed for potters who already have basic wheel-throwing experience and are looking to refine their craftsmanship and expand their creative techniques. Throughout the series, students will explore creating and fitting lidded jars; using different styles and techniques for handles; learning basic surface design and decoration; using finishing techniques for polished, functional pottery; and refining forms and improving consistency on the wheel. Wheel Throwing Fundamentals: 4-Week Pottery Class

Discover the art of pottery in this 4-week introductory wheel-throwing class designed for beginners or anyone looking to build a strong foundation on the pottery wheel. Students will learn the essential techniques needed to create beautiful, functional ceramic pieces while gaining confidence working with clay. In addition to throwing, students will learn important finishing skills, including proper drying techniques, trimming the base of their pieces, and basic glazing methods to prepare their work for kiln firing. Grid-Based Gelli Plate Collage: Layering, Pattern & Metallic Details

Discover the creative possibilities of combining Gelli Plate printing with collage in this hands-on mixed media workshop. Students will create a collection of printed papers using Gelli Plate techniques and then transform those papers into structured grid-based compositions that explore pattern, color, texture, and balance. Throughout the workshop, participants will learn how to create visually engaging artwork by building compositions from layered printed papers while exploring how artists use repetition, contrast, and focal points to create dynamic designs. This class is perfect for beginners, mixed media artists, paper lovers, and anyone who enjoys experimentation and process-based artmaking.

Creative Crafts: Ages 5 & Up

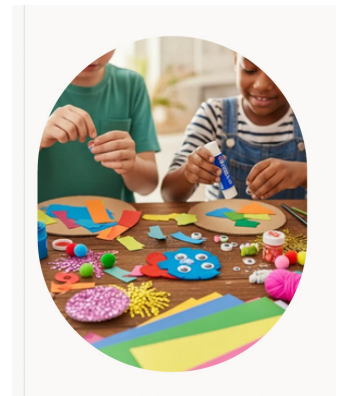
